MEETING MINUTES

- 1 Call to Order – the meeting was called to order at 4:10pm
- 2 Minutes from March meeting – Mark Stivers made a motion to approve the March minutes as presented. Mike Ridgeway seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. Tony Robalik and Bill Hoffman abstained since they were not in attendance at the March meeting.
- 3 TIP Update – Lauri Ahlskog explained the information that was included in the TIP Update packet that each member received.
- 4 Smart Transportation Task Force Recommendation – Mark Stivers explained the purpose of the task force. He feels that BPAC should provide input on the process that is being created. Mike Ridgeway questioned whether PennDOT's bike/ped checklist is being included in the process. Mr. Stivers will forward the information to the committee.
- 5 S. Duke Street over Conestoga River bridge replacement Recommendation - Lauri Ahlskog reported that the committee's recommendation was forwarded to PennDOT and they are in agreement with BPAC's recommendation.
- 6 New TIGER Grant - Mark Stivers reported that the committee that put together the first TIGER grant application is reconvening May 27th about applying for a TIGER II grant.
- 7 PA462 bridge replacement in Mountville - Mark Stivers showed the committee a project design plan that has a bike detour route. The committee felt this was great and would like to see this on more projects. Ms. Ahlskog will check with the engineer about how this came about. BPAC will present this at TTAC. Ms. Ahlskog will also forward the construction schedule to the committee.
- 7 Peak Oil Shortage - Tony Robalik



would like BPAC to take this topic into consideration in our transportation planning, not just for bike/ped projects

8 Other Business & Public Participation

Bill Hoffman asked if the bike/ped checklist was completed for the commercial development occurring adjacent to the intersection of Oregon Pike and Landis Valley Road. Ms. Ahlskog replied that most likely it was not done because these improvements are being done by the developer, it's not a PennDOT project.

Bill Hoffman reported that Manheim Township has asked Representative Bear for funding to install a separate bike detection loop with on-road pavement markings and associated signage at the intersection of Eden Road and New Holland Pike. Manheim Township will also be installing pavement markings to indicate where the loops are to trip the traffic signal.
