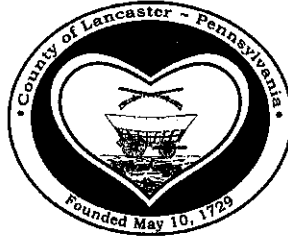

PROCLAMATION

National Women's History Month

WHEREAS, between 1988 and 1994, Congress passed additional resolutions requesting and authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month; and

WHEREAS, since 1995, Presidents Clinton, Bush, Obama and Trump have issued a series of annual proclamations designating the month of March as "Women's History Month"; and

WHEREAS, women of every race, class and ethnic background have made historic contributions to the growth and strength of the nation and the world in countless recorded and unrecorded ways; and

WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play a critical economic, cultural and social role in every sphere of the life of the nation by constituting a significant portion of the labor force working inside and outside the home; and

WHEREAS, American women were particularly important in the establishment of early charitable, philanthropic and cultural institutions in the nation; and



