ACT 80 OF 2012 (BLOCK GRANT)

- Human Services Block Grant Program allows for State funding to be allocated to county governments to provide locally identified county-based human services
- Allows counties to develop a uniform, consolidated process for counties to submit plans and reports.
- Pilot Program – Lancaster was one of 20 counties selected for participation in the initial phase.



County Human Services Funding Includes:

- Mental Health Community Based Funded Services;
- Behavioral Health Services Initiative (MH & D/A);
- Intellectual Disabilities Community Based Funds;
- Act 152 Funds;
- Homeless Assistance Program Funds;
- Human Services Development Funds



TIMELINE

- One “Sunshined” public hearing with testimonials:
July 15, 2022, at 1:00 PM in Room 701, 150 North Queen Street
- Presentation to County Commissioners and Anticipated Approval/Implementation - July 27, 2022
- Plan submitted to the State after Commissioners’ approval

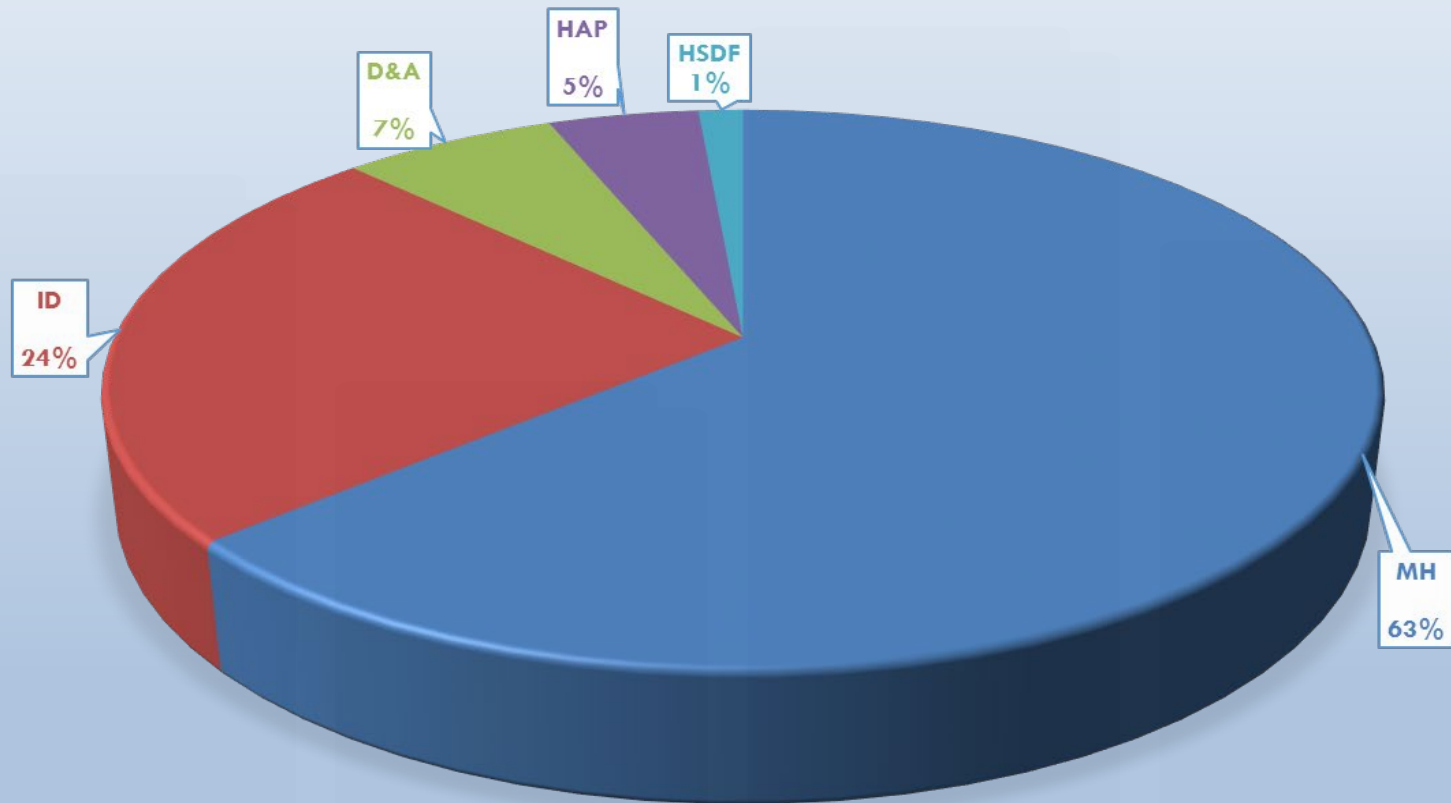


REQUIRED MINIMUM EXPENDITURES

- Expend State block grant funds in the following manner:
 - FY 2012-2013 – 80%
 - FY 2013-2014 – 75%
 - FY 2014-2015 – 50 %
 - FY 2015-2016 – 25%
 - FY 2016-2017 and thereafter – 100% County discretion
- Required for all State funds in the block grant **except** for HSF (formerly HSDF)
