WHEREAS, the following polling places are being moved for the 2026 General Primary: Lancaster City – Eighth Ward, Third Precinct is moving from Pearl Street United Methodist Church to Redeemer Lutheran Church due to the former location's permanent unavailability; Mount Joy Borough – East Ward is moving from the Mount Joy Borough Office to St Mark's United Methodist Church due to the former location's move and construction; Lancaster Township – fourth district is moving from Lancaster Seventh Day Adventist church to Lancaster City Parks Department administrative office due to the former location's unavailability; Manor Township – Manor, New East district is moving from Central Manor Church to Grace Baptist Church of Millersville due to finding the location a permanent home; Warwick Township – Millport district is moving from Jerusalem Lutheran Church to St Paul's EC Church due to the former location's permanent unavailability.

Update on the May 19, 2026 Primary Election

Christa Miller, Chief Clerk/Chief Registrar

Christa Miller reported that Lancaster County currently has 362,516 registered voters. To date, 23,359 mail-in ballot requests have been received. Mail ballots will begin going out on April 16, 2026, and in-person mail-in ballots will be available at the Elections Office counter beginning Monday, April 20, 2026.

Poll worker training began this week, with more sessions than usual due to the addition of new judges and inspectors. Trainings have been successful, with four to five sessions still to be held. Logic and Accuracy testing was completed last week, and election programming is scheduled for next week. The voter registration deadline is May 4, 2026; voters are encouraged to verify their registration status. The deadline to request a mail-in ballot is May 12, 2026, at 5:00 p.m.

On motion of Commissioner Parsons, seconded by Commissioner Yoder, the meeting adjourned at 11:13 a.m.
