Commissioner D'Agostino called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

Commissioner D'Agostino announced approval of the April 15, 2026, Election Board meeting minutes.

**Public Hearing re: Proposed Polling Place Changes**

Commissioner D'Agostino opened the Public Hearing at 11:03 a.m.

Christa Miller stated that there are five proposed polling place changes in Lancaster City, Mount Joy Borough, Lancaster Township, Manor Township, and Warwick Township. These proposed changes were posted to the public last Wednesday, April 15.

Barbara Strasko, Lancaster Township Resident, expressed concerns about the proposed polling place change in Lancaster Township – Fourth District, stating that it may be difficult for the public to access due to its location, as well as the lack of a crossing and sidewalks. She stated that she realizes that there are not many places in the precinct that can easily accommodate a polling place given the residential nature of the precinct and is willing to assist in finding another location if this one does not work out well.

**Update on the May 19, 2026, Primary Election**

Christa Miller reported that there are currently 362,599 registered voters in Lancaster County. There have been 23,946 mail ballot requests to date, of which 4,453 have already been returned to the Election and Voter Registration Office. She reminded voters that the deadline to register for the Primary Election is May 4. Voters may register in person at the office by 5:00 p.m. or online by 11:59 p.m. that day. The deadline to request a mail-in ballot is May 12 at 5:00 p.m., whether submitted in person or online. The Election and Voter Registration Office also accepts completed mail-in ballots in person at the counter through May 12.

The Primary Election will be held on May 19. All ballots must be returned to the Election and Voter Registration Office by 8:00 p.m. that day.

Christa Miller also noted that the Election and Voter Registration Office will extend its hours on Thursday, May 14, and Friday, May 15, until 8:00 p.m. The office will be open on Saturday, May 16, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m., and on Election Day, May 19, from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

Commissioner D'Agostino added that the Election and Voter Registration Office completed poll worker training last week. He attended one of the sessions and noted that it was well done and served as a helpful refresher.
