

Instructions for voting by Absentee or Mail-in ballot

Mark your ballot as soon as possible. The deadline for you to cast your voted ballot is 8 p.m. on election day.

Please use a black or blue ink pen to mark your choices on the ballot. To vote for your choice in each contest, mark the box provided to the left of your choice with a cross (X) or by completely filling in the box. To vote for a write-in candidate, mark the box provided to the left of the words "Write-in" and print the name of the candidate on the line provided.

After voting, fold the ballot, and you must place the ballot in the plain white envelope marked "Official Election Ballot" and seal securely. Do not put any extraneous marks or identifying symbols on the ballot or the ballot envelope, otherwise the ballot may be declared void.

Place the plain white Official Election Ballot envelope containing the voted ballot in the larger Official Ballot return envelope addressed to the County Board of Elections. Other than the plain white Official Election Ballot envelope, nothing else may be enclosed in this return envelope.

Sign, date and complete the Voter's Declaration as printed on the back of the return envelope. Securely seal the return envelope and mail or personally deliver your own ballot to the County Board of Elections.

Please be aware that there is no next day delivery for first class mail and that the voter is responsible for timely delivery of their ballot to the Board of Elections.
