All Inmates

With summer on its way and many staff and inmates opting to get the COVID vaccine it appears a more typical life is on the horizon for LCP. Having said this, the COVID-19 fight is still not over. WE MUST REMAIN VIGILANT!

Moving forward, the following COVID-19 practices will remain in place:

- Directives for mask wearing outside of your cell remain in effect.
- Social distancing effort when outside of your cell.
- Increased cleaning throughout the building.

The below operational changes will begin going into effect as noted over the next couple weeks:

Monday, May 10th, 2021

Block Out

- General population will block out in full tiers.
- G-1 and 2-5 will continue with cohort block outs.
- 2-1 and 2-2 will block out in full tiers except when cohorts are present.

Visits

- Visits times will be split by top and bottom tier.
- Visitors may call in between 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday one day before a housing unit's scheduled visit to reserve a visit time.
- The Prison website is being updated with daily new visit times as noted below:
Mornings: 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m. – 10:00 a.m.
Afternoons: 1:00 p.m. – 2:00 p.m., 2:00 p.m. – 3:00 p.m.
Evenings: 6:30 p.m. – 7:30 p.m., 7:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m., and 8:30 p.m. – 9:30 p.m.
- Times will go by tier instead of by cell, allowing inmates more opportunity for visit.

Chow

- Inmates will be left out in half tiers to receive their trays
- Inmate will continue to feed in their cells.

Legal Visits

- All legal visits permitted starting May 10th.

Treatment/Programming

- 2 Drug and Alcohol groups will begin running.
- Chaplains may see inmates off the housing units (general population blocks only, no inmates on cohort status).
- MHU church service will begin running with chaplain volunteers on the block beginning Wednesdays, May 12th from 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.

Monday May 17th, 2021

- Reentry groups will start May 17th.

Vaccine Clinic - to be held on Tuesday May 25th.

Haircuts - Barber will start covering housing units on an entire floor, as scheduled in one day.

Finally, we continue to recognize everything is more difficult due to COVID-19. It is understandable that you may be experiencing high levels of stress, anxiety, and feelings of hopelessness. If you need to speak with someone or are concerned about another inmate, reach out to any staff member including officers, counselor, medical, mental Health, or the chaplains.

Take note to changes in behavior of those around you. Stay alert to the warning signs of suicide which may include anxiety, feeling trapped, hopelessness, withdrawal from others, anger/rage, dramatic mood swings/change in behavior, or giving personal items away.

All staff appreciate your cooperation in following the COVID-19 policies. If you have any questions speak to the corrections officer or specialist posted on your housing unit or contact the security supervisor using the kiosk. Thank you for participating in efforts to keep everyone safe.

Please be advised that any of the above policies or services may be suspended or altered based on operational needs due to COVID-19.
